Guidelines for Submitting Homework

All homework should be submitted in the form of a zip file which contains one program for each question. Your zipfile should be named *firstname-lastname-hw0.zip* and should contain files like hw0q1, hw0q2, hw0q3, etc... **Make sure your name also appears in all source code files!** Email this zip file to cs306@cis.uab.edu. **When emailing this file email a copy to yourself so you know the email went through ok.**

1. Type in the following Hello World! program and get it to work on a Perl platform of your choice.

```
#!/usr/bin/perl
# NOTE: The above line may change depending on Blazers/Linux/platform!
# Joe Smith, CS306, 5/31/06
# This program says hello

print "Hello World!\n";
```

Create a file named `helloworld.pl` and type in these lines exactly as they appear. Once you have done so, in the directory with the file type the command `perl helloworld.pl` and check that your program outputs “Hello World!”

This semester all work is to be graded in the Linux operating system environment, and you are strongly urged to complete your work in this environment as well. If you use Linux at home, Perl is almost definitely already there. Type ‘perl -v’ at a command prompt to check that Perl is there.

To use Perl under the Unix Blazers in the department, use your CIS Unix account to access the blazers, and use **this full path to Perl: `/hf/sol8/bin/perl`** *There are multiple versions on the blazers but this is the one you want.* The new Linux lab machines also have Perl, and no full path is necessary (more in class about these). Both are accessible remotely. You need a CIS Unix account:
